What does it mean to be a man, to be a father? We need to look no further than at Jesus Christ. Pilate said of Him, clothed with purple, crowned with thorns, and dripping with blood: "**Behold, the man!**" And Jesus said of Himself: "He who has seen me has seen the Father."

To understand more concretely what masculinity after the example of Jesus looks like, I would like to share a litany written by Fr. Paul Hoelsing, the current rector of Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis where Trey and I have been formed to be priests.
